

Last Opportunity to Sail on a Tall Ship This Year

ABERDEEN, Wash. - The last opportunity for Grays Harbor residents to sail on Lady Washington and Hawaiian Chieftain in 2010 is Saturday, October 2 in Westport. The ships have scheduled their final Battle Sail of the summer season at 2 p.m., departing from the Westport Marina. A Battle Sail features a recreation of a typical 18th century naval action with close-quarters maneuvers and cannon fire (with blanks). Tickets for the three-hour living history experience are \$60 adults, \$50 students/seniors/active military, \$40 children 12 and under. Purchase tickets online at www.historicalseaport.org or call 800-200-5239. Tickets may also be purchased at the boats. In addition to the Battle Sail, both vessels will be open for walk-on tours from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday. Crew in period costume will welcome visitors. An on-board gift shop will be open. A \$3 donation per visitor is appreciated.

After the Battle Sail, Lady Washington and Hawaiian Chieftain will depart for Fort Columbia State Park on the Columbia River and a re-enactment of a fur trade meeting with canoe paddlers of the Chinook Nation.
